EVENTS: Students and parents began boycotting schools in District 1 on the lower east side. Why?

-In the last school board election, six United Federation of Teachers-supported members (who have no children attending local schools) were Ilegally elected to fill 6 out of the 9 seats on the community school board. Acting against the interest of the community, the Board members voted for the suspension of Luis Fuentes—the community elected superintendent who since his appintment by the parents last August 1972, has supported bilingual, remedial and multi-ethnic programs towards ethnic understanding—on October 16,1973. In protest, parents and students began the boycot on oct. 17, and by oct. 19 under community pressure, the court reinstated Fuentes TELFORARILY.

DEMANDS: The boycott of the schools will continue until:

7. we achieve real community control by: 1. the reinstatement of Fuentes permanently as the community recognized and elected superintendent of school district #1.

2. that the illiegal school board be removed

3. taht new elections for a new school board is set up

4. that decisions made by parents under the Decentralization laws are

enforced and recognized.

5. that all existing programs continue.
6. that all types of descrimination be removed from our schools.

WHY STUDENTS JUST ORGANIZE: students in the universities, who have more flexible schedules than working parents, are urgently urged to ome down to the community and help work on this immediate issue in district one, presently, schools in the chinatown area are located in school district 2, whwever, with the influx of immigrants from china, hong dong, taiwan the boundaries of chinatown proper are expanding northward towards the 14th street area into district one to meet the needs of the chinese students (6% of the total student population of a predominantly puerto rican, black and increasing asian community) presently enrolled and the future students, we must begin organizing/informing/educating/helping the chinese students and parents in the area, and working jointly with other minority groups, who are working towards the same programs and goals.

-to coordinate central administration -- typing, keeping track of what is happening, contact other community organizations, etc.

-contact with teachers and other educators

-leafleting to parents and schools

-people to go with parents to meetings in the central office in the school district one

-people to be at the schools talking and explaining the issues of the boycott to parents, students, at the elementary schools and the students in the junior high schools.

-stuffing mailboxes, making posters to publicize in the chinatown

community and district one area.
